 - Section 20 and 20 bis of the Civil Procedure Code (Amendment No. 17 B.E. 2542 (1999))
 - The Regulations of the President of the Supreme Court on Mediation, B.E. 2554 (2011) provides for a comprehensive set of the regulations for mediation.
 - In a case ending with judgment rendered as agreed terms by the parties through mediation, or if there is a withdrawal of a case entirely, a court often refunds the court fee at the rate of ¾ or 7/8.

- Support every court through out the country (255 courts, all three levels) on their court-annexed mediation program—in terms of budget, training and other activities:
 - Marketing mediation through publications (Pamphlets, charts, books, CDs, radio shows, road shows including school for peer and community mediation)
 - 2. Symposiums (ODR—online dispute resolution, AEC era, mediation for medical mal-practice dispute) raise awareness+ current issues in society

- 3. Training: court officers, judges, mediators (roughly 20 trainings per fiscal year)
 - -For court officer: administration of mediation office, basic knowledge on mediation
 - -Mediators
 - -Judges –working with SMC, Straus Institute for Dispute Resolution, Pepperdine School of Law, etc. (train the trainers)
